Chalk Decorative Paint is a matte finish paint that can be applied over various substrates with minimum to no surface prep. It applies smoothly and provides excellent hide. Available in a wide variety of colors, the complementary waxes can add layers of protection in addition to enhancing the color and adding character to any surface.

### **Can BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint be used alone for a matte finish?**

Yes, when applied alone, BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint dries to a matte, soft touch finish – perfect for achieving a velvet and chalky look.

### **Can BEHR® Wax Decorative Finish be layered with other waxes?**

Yes, you can layer the waxes in any desired combination to achieve certain looks and seal in the color.

### **What types of surfaces can I use BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint on?**

BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint can be applied over most existing surfaces with very little surface preparation. Perfect for refreshing old and new wooden furniture, cast stone, concrete, and even metal surfaces<sup>†</sup> to create one-of-a-kind accent pieces.

<sup>†</sup> For improved adhesion, prime all uncoated metal, cast stone and concrete surfaces before painting.

### **Can I use BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint outdoors?**

We do not recommend using BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint outdoors without a protective coat.

### **Can I use BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint in high traffic or areas that get moisture?**

BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint can be used in high traffic or high moisture areas with the addition of a topcoat adding a layer of protection.

### **Is it the same as Chalk Board Paint?**

This is NOT chalkboard paint and is not recommended to be written on. BEHR® Chalk Decorative Paint is recommended to upcycle & inject new life into furniture pieces and accessories giving them the desired decorative finish with our 2-part paint and wax system.

### **How many coats of Chalk Style Paint do you need to apply?**

You may need to apply 1-2 coats for maximum coverage hide, depending on the color and desired look. For example, lighter colors may require 2 coats, while dark and muted colors may only require 1 coat.
